USAID's MEASURE Evaluation Project is pleased to announce that the University of Pretoria's School of Health Systems and Public Health is once again accepting applications for their Master of Public Health Program. MEASURE Evaluation has been collaborating with this South African university to offer a concentration in monitoring and evaluation as part of our effort to build capacity in this important aspect of population, health and nutrition programs in the Africa region. We would appreciate your assistance in identifying qualified candidates for this program.

Coursework for the 18-month Master in Public Health Degree Program will begin January 2012. All curricula will be taught in English and will train students in data collection, analysis and use and evaluation of population and health information.

The cost of tuition for the 2012-13 MPH program is US \$6,700. A limited number of fellowships are available from the MEASURE Evaluation Project for citizens of USAID-assisted countries in the Anglophone Africa region, to cover expenses for the period January 2012 – July 2013. Applicants should express their intent to apply for this fellowship by submitting with the Application Form, a resume, a letter from your employer supporting your proposed course of study, two references, and an essay detailing their background and experience in monitoring and evaluation and reasons for wishing to attend the program. Competitive candidates will have a bachelor's degree, English language proficiency and computer literacy. Professionals with interest or work experience in research and evaluation of population and health programs are preferred. **The application deadline is June 30, 2011.**
